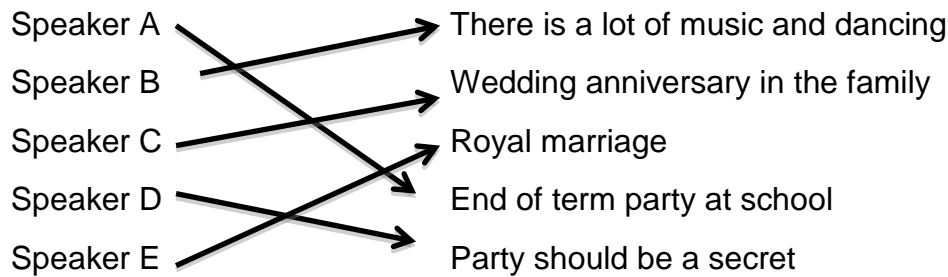
E
