So, erm, I really enjoy the travelling.

Speaker 4 (Female, British)

I love Switzerland because, er, it seems so orderly and tidy and the trains always run on time, and everything is so clean. The flowers in the towns are beautiful, erm, the fountains in the, in the towns, the lakes – it all seems so beautiful, almost unreal. I love the mountains and ... the cows ... and of course the cheese and the, the food.

Speaker 5 (Male, British)

Right, what I like about Switzerland is it's a very clean country and it seems to be very well organized. It has spectacularly beautiful countryside; it has a kind of mix of mountains and lakes and, er, beautiful pasturelands and vineyards ... and I, I really appreciate that kind of, er, scenery.

Speaker 6 (Male, Swiss)

OK, so I, I live in Nyon. It's a very beautiful town with a castle from the 13th century which was completely renovated. Err, it overlooks the lake of Geneva, which is er, err, the second largest lake in Switzerland. Erm, what else? Err I, what do I like about Nyon? Err, er, it has an atmosphere; it's large enough you find er, all the basic services; it has, er, I think about 15,000 inhabitants; erm, and it's, err – in miles I guess – so it's 20 miles away from Geneva, which is of course better known.
